An Aberdeen Angus cow & her Limousin bull calf (1mth) sold to £1045 & a Simmental cow & her Limousin heifer calf (1mth) sold to £1030 from Exors of Mr R Potter, Grittleton. An incalf Gloucester cow sold to £712 from Mr A Hall, Birlingham & incalf Galloway to £818 from M/s B, C & N Ford, Driffield.

Avg: Steers £840 (198p/kg), Heifers £847 (181p/kg)

A pleasing entry sold to another very good trade with the best cattle still very dear but a few of the smaller, second quality sorts maybe a shade less.

The stronger near meat steers traded between £1200 - £1260 topping at £1340 twice (170p/kg) for an Aberdeen Angus & (171p/kg) for a Limousin from M/s J D Wright & Son, Baydon & Mr G Morse, Whitminster respectively. The stronger farming steers saw the better sorts £1150 - £1200 (190 - 195p/kg) with the general stronger sorts £1050 - £1100 (190 - 210p/kg).

The younger & medium steers were again well sold between £800 - £900 (185 - 220p/kg).

The Friesian steers saw a top of £1062 (158p/kg) from M/s J D Wright & Son, Baydon with the stronger sorts generally £850 - £960 (145 - 158p/kg). The medium steers were £720 - £850 (150 - 160p/kg) with a few younger & smaller sorts £300 - £350 (120 - 140p/kg).

The stronger, near meat heifers were £1170 - £1200 topping at £1225 (178p/kg) for British Blue's again from M/s J D Wright & Son, Baydon with Aberdeen Angus to £1185 (174p/kg) from M/s B, C & N Ford, Driffield. The stronger farming heifers were again a good trade between £960 - £1085 (170 - 185p/kg) with the better younger sorts £850 - £1000 (190 - 210p/kg) & general sorts £700 - £800 (170 - 180p/kg). The lesser sorts were a shade easier mostly between £450 - £550 (145 - 165p/kg).

The weaned calves saw Aberdeen Angus steers (7mths) to £670 (212p/kg) from Mrs J Herdman, North Cerney & £680 from Ms L Muller, North Cerney. Aberdeen Angus steers (8 - 15mths) to £770 from Mr G Potheary, Cricklade & (5mths) to £400 (250p/kg) from M/s E & M Price, Frocester. Charolais steers (9 - 13mths) sold to £900 (227p/kg) & £840 (258p/kg) from M/s B & R Gammond & Son, Lechlade. Limousin steers (12 - 13mths) sold to £1010 (232p/kg) from M/s T Limbrick & Son, Sherborne.

Cattle can enter an Orange market if they have tested negative within 90 days of a new or repeat herd test, even if reactors are found (reactors must be removed from the holding prior to applying for a licence).

Cattle are **NO LONGER ALLOWED** to return home.

The only onward movement allowed will be to an Approved Finishing Unit (AFU) or an abattoir.

A pleasing entry that included many older (2-3 month) weaned calves that met another good trade with plenty of buyers present.

Fresh calves saw Friesian bulls to £160 for K D Sheridan and £105 for Ian Godwin averaging £88. Only medium Native breeds bulls on offer selling mid £200's to top at £232 for Aberdeen Angus and £228 for Ian Godwin.

A sprinkling of Continentals saw best British Blue bulls to £395 and £370 for PJ & SR Bennett with first quality Simmentals from B Gough at £445 and £435. Heifer trade on a par, British Blue to £282 for PJ & SR Bennett. Simmentals to £222 for W J Hunt. Natives in strong demand with the better sorts not dear compared to the 3rd quality. Two very good Aberdeen Angus heifers £182 and £162 for R&R Baker, 3rd quality over £100.

Weaned section booming today with 31 penned. Friesian to £318 from C&E Best, averaging £207 with a run of Fleckvieh steers that sold really well to £318 for D Lovat & Son, Aberdeen Angus bulls to £462 from PJ & SR Bennett and Hereford steers to £400 from C&E Best.

In the heifer section C&E Best saw British Blues to £460 and Aberdeen Angus to £365 and Herefords to £320. Generally a strong demand for weaned calves worthy of the hard work put in by vendors to get the calves

Having never seen the sheep as dear as last week, numbers have flooded out and supply and demand kicks in. It was always going to be the week of everyone disappointed following the last 10 days of sheep trading but let's be realistic. A fortnight ago the best hoggetts were 240p/kg & heavies to £110 and everyone was happy. Today's trade saw an average of 240p/kg with heavies to £130 and everyone's a bit disappointed. Sheep being sold at over 300p/kg is not sustainable.

Meat has been the key everywhere this week with the best meat, good shaped hogs still 255 - 265p/kg topping at 288p/kg £121 for 42kg from M/s P & C Houldey. The general run of meat hogs were 225 - 240p/kg. The leaner sorts were well sold but with more sheep about buyers can be more selective between 190 - 210p/kg dependent on breed.

The heavier hoggetts again saw the meat well sold but less than last week between £115 - £125 topping at £130 for 65½kg from Mr R Saunders.
