Considering the closeness to Christmas & the wintry weather of the last few days today saw a short but pleasing entry with plenty of buyers in attendance. A mixed show of cattle saw the few stronger farming sorts topping at £965 (172p/kg) for Hereford steers from M/s R & S Blackwell, Nailsworth & £925 (170p/kg) for an Aberdeen Angus heifer from M/s C Cadogan & Son, Awre. The general cattle traded between £780 - £850 (160 - 175p/kg). A run of younger cattle saw Hereford bulls (5 - 7mths) to £422 (234p/kg) from M/s J & M Ravenhill, Minchinhampton & Aberdeen Angus steers (11mths) to £492 (218p/kg) from M/s L Simmons & Partners, Kingswood. A handful of grazing cows saw an Aberdeen Angus to £940 & Montbelliarde to £765 from M/s Brockhill Farm Stud, Naunton.

The good shaped meat lambs traded between 185 - 195p/kg topping at 222p/kg £90 for 40½kg from Mr A Goscombe. The good commercial lambs traded between 175 - 180p/kg with the leaner & lesser breeds 165 - 172p/kg.

The heavier lambs were generally £78 - £84 but not much quality in this weight bracket.

A short entry due to the weather met a good trade throughout, with the majority of better birds £8 - £15.

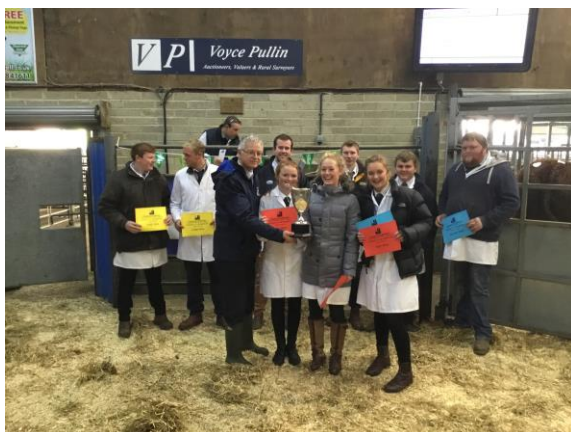

A good covering of snow throughout Gloucestershire failed to halt the Dispersal Sale of first quality machinery on behalf of the Comer Family on 11th December 2017. Two decisions made all the difference, moving the sale to the hardstanding of Cirencester Livestock Market Sale Yard alongside a delayed start time from 11.00 to 12.30 pm allowing those travelling from all corners of the country to get here in good time. The sale yard was packed and all sold very well. The Krone BigX700 self-propelled harvester topped the day's trade at £140,000 with other big ticket items including the 2007 JCB 434S exceeding expectations to achieve £47,750 with buckets with the New Holland T7.270 making £46,200 and the T7.210 at £40,600. Throughout the day all machinery was in high demand even out of season and older kit commanded a premium. Footfall on the day was incredible with over 400 buyers registered the sale aided by good advertising and enthused by no buyers premium.
