93 REARING CALVES

10.30 am – Auctioneers: Jon Pullin Bulls £390. Heifers £272

A mixture of fresh and weaned calves available today generally speaking quality of an indifferent nature with a few best sorts reaching the same values as in previous weeks.

Best Continental bulls to £390 twice for T & H Barber, 14 forward to avg £320, no other Continental breeds on offer! Aberdeen Angus and Hereford represented but stale calves only best of these to £200, quality shown by an Angus Bull avg of £88, Herefords at £126. Friesians and Angus sold on par for type, top Friesians £55, Brown Swiss to £70.

A good heifer trade saw a bit more quality British Blue heifers to £272 from AW Jones and £260 for T & H Barber, Limousin to £250 all others medium quality or less. A superb Hereford heifer from Ian Godwin made £232

A strong entry of weaned calves saw Friesians to £190 from WR Agriculture Ltd, £170 for Ian Godwin. Blondes sold to £295 whilst a pair of decent British Blue bulls from RD Horton & Son made a good £400 and £440. British Blue heifers also sold to £415 from RD Horton.

A much improved entry saw a wonderful show of quality cattle which met a trade to match. All cattle continue to sell extremely well and more could have been sold to advantage.

The stronger, short term near meat or best shaped farming steers traded over £1180 topping at £1265 (213p/kg) & £1230 (191p/kg) for Limousin & British Blue's from M/s H P Nicholas & Son, High Woolaston. £1238 (200p/kg) for Blonde & Limousin's from M/s R & S Bliss, Daglingworth & £1205 (170p/kg) for an Aberdeen Angus from Mr L Smith, Saul.

The stronger farming steers saw some grand cattle on offer trading between £1050 - £1150 (180 – 210p/kg) with Simmental's to £1192 (182p/kg) from Mr C D Hill, Headley & £1162 (202p/kg) for Charolais' from Mr S Coates, Haresfield. The mid age farming steers again seemed exceptionally well sold with the better steers £990 - £1050 (185 – 200p/kg). The younger farming cattle were also extremely well sold between £850 - £950 (190 – 210p/kg) with Charolais steers (11 – 12mnths) to £1000 (215p/kg) from M/s A & P Cutler & Son, Fairford.

The Friesian steers saw the stronger sorts selling between £810 - £965 (145 – 165p/kg) topping at £1140 (181p/kg) for British Friesians from M/s H P Nicholas & Son, High Woolaston. The medium farming sorts were £630 - £788 (140 – 150p/kg) with the lesser sorts £450 - £600 (130 – 140p/kg).

The short term, near meat Continental heifers traded over £1000 topping at £1145 (170p/kg) & £ 1140 (188p/kg) again from M/s H P Nicholas & Son, High Woolaston. The stronger farming sorts were £920 - £1000 (185 – 195p/kg) with the general farming Continental heifers were £860 - £950 (175 – 190p/kg). The native breeds topped at £1082 (183p/kg) for

Aberdeen Angus from M/s Lodge Farms, Brinkworth with the stronger farming sorts £800 - £900 (170 – 180p/kg).

The younger stores & weaned calves again seemed well sold with British Blue steers (5 – 8mnths) to £635 (282p/kg) from M/s Blackhouse Farms, Newent with their British Blue heifers to £520 (241p/kg). South Devon steers (9 – 10mnths) sold to £840 (221p/kg) from Mr R Wilson, Wood Stanley with his heifers to £745 (188p/kg). Aberdeen Angus steers (10mnths) sold to £745 (219p/kg) from Mr J Hughes, Donnington. & (6 – 10mnths) to £575 (226p/kg) from Mr W Smith, Wanborough.

APPLYING FOR A LICENCE HAS NOW CHANGED

Rather than making your application by telephone, Animal health now require a completed application form (tb204) to be completed & emailed / posted to CSC.TBlicensing@apha.gis.gov.uk

APHA, Polwhele, Truro, Cornwall, TR4 9AD

Please note: Licenses are issued on a first come first served basis & may take up to 5 working days to process. As such, short notice requests may not be issued in time. Cattle can enter an Orange market if they have tested negative within 90 days of a new or repeat herd test, even if reactors are found (reactors must be removed from the holding prior to applying for a licence).

Cattle are **NO LONGER ALLOWED** to return home.

The only onward movement allowed will be to an Approved Finishing Unit (AFU) or an abattoir.

FARM ASSURANCE INFORMATION

Any RTA assured Beef and Lamb farmer who uses rented land / grass keep for their livestock (tenants as described below) must make sure the certification body has the location listed as an additional unit on their RTA membership. They can contact the CB at any time during the year to add additional locations and the CBs will have a form for them to complete. This form will ask what activity is carried out at the location to determine if it needs to be assessed. Just grass keep does not need assessing but anything with housing or feed storage will.

It is vital farmers register these locations, otherwise, Traceability checks by processors will question if the location is Assured. This does happen and causes considerable issues with processors trying to reject livestock and farmers desperately trying to get CBs to add the location ASAP.

Another good entry but not quite as many as last week & not generally the quality either. The hoggett trade remains remarkable good due to a shortage of New Zealand meat coming into the country. This could easily change so keep drawing sheep while the trade is good.

Generally not the best quality in the handyweight hoggs with the few better sorts 205 - 210p/kg topping at 211p/kg £88 for 42kg from Mr D M Clark. The few leaner sorts & lesser bred types sold well between 200 - 205p/kg. The medium weight range saw the better sheep 205 - 210p/kg topping at 211p/kg £95 for 45kg from M/s Westwell Farms with the rest all around £2 or above.

The heavier hoggs continue to sell well around £2kg or £100 with the best £110+ topping at £117 for 63½kg from Miss S Ractliffe.
