## 5 BEEF COWS & CALVES

A few incalf & grazing cows saw an incalf Aberdeen Angus due July to £785 from Mrs G Greenaway, Cirencester. Limousin grazing cows to £960 (150p/kg) from M/s T R Limbrick & Son, Sherborne & a British Blue to £890 (148p/kg) from Mr R Gay, Shrivenham. A Simmental bull sold to £1520 from Ms C Wheeler, Piling and a Blonde to £1400 from M/s G Maidment & Son, Cleverton.

Another reasonable entry considering the summer weather taking preference with silaging & planting.

The entry saw a very mixed bag but the medium & better cattle still as dear but the edge just off the younger & second quality sorts.

The stronger farming steers were another very good trade between were £1100 - £11870 (190 - 210p/kg) topping at £1192 (209p/kg) for a Hereford steer from M/s J I Jones & Son, Down Hatherley with their British Blue steers to £1178 (228p/kg). The medium term, farming steers saw the better sorts £1000 - £1050 (190 - 220p/kg) topping at £1080 (222p/kg) for Aberdeen Angus from Mr P Dangerfield, Stroud. The general stronger steers were £950 - £1050 (185 - 200p/kg).

The younger & medium steers were again well between £850 - £950 (190 - 210p/kg) topping at £1070 (227p/kg) for Limousin steers (12 - 13mths) from M/s G Ripley & Son, Daglingworth. The few lesser sorts were a shade easier between £600 - £700 (170 - 180p/kg) generally but more down to quality.

Mostly medium type Friesian steers saw a top of £790 (147p/kg) from M/s F Everett & Son, Shipton on Stour. The younger sorts were £400 - £470 (145 - 160p/kg).

Not many stronger, short term farming heifers on offer trading around £1000 topping at £1040 (192p/kg) for British Blue's from M/s J I Jones & Son, Down Hatherley. The stronger farming heifers were again a good trade between £850 - £950 (190 - 200p/kg) with the better younger sorts £800 - £880 (180 - 210p/kg) & general sorts £700 - £800 (170 - 180p/kg).

A very mixed show of weaned calves met another good trade with Aberdeen Angus steers (5 - 6mths) to £445 (261p/kg) from M/s K & C Gough, Ogbourne St George. & (6 - 7mths) to £488 (212p/kg) from Ms C Furness, Honeybourne. Also (7mths) to £675 (204p/kg) from M/s C Logan & Son, Brinkworth & (6 - 7mths) to £660 (209p/kg) from M/s J D Wright & Son, Baydon. Their British Blue steers (7 - 9mths) sold to £725 (254p/kg) with Limousin heifers (9 - 12mths) to £730 (214p/kg) from M/s F & S Robins, Two Bridges.

**Please note:** Licenses are issued on a first come first served basis & may take up to 5 working days to process. As such, short notice requests may not be issued in time. Cattle can enter an Orange market if they have tested negative within 90 days of a new or repeat herd test, even if reactors are found (reactors must be removed from the holding prior to applying for a licence).

Cattle are **NO LONGER ALLOWED** to return home.

The only onward movement allowed will be to an Approved Finishing Unit (AFU) or an abattoir.

**NEW RULES OF ENTRIES ARE RESTRICTED TO  
ONE PEN, PER CLASS, PER UK FLOCK NUMBER**

- S234** Pen of five even lambs by any sire, out of an unrelated breed of ewe, suitable for the Butchers retail trade weighing a maximum of 215kg (43kg & under)
- S235** Pen of five even lambs, three quarter bred up to pure bred suitable for the Butchers retail trade weighing a maximum of 215kg (43kg & under)

At each market one of the lambs from each of the pens of five will be balloted to be judged once slaughtered. The remaining four lambs in each pen MUST be offered for sale in the market. The balloted lambs from each market will be sent to the same abattoir and judging of the respective carcasses will take place in the abattoir and presented in the refrigerated display units for the duration of the show. All exhibits will be MLC classified. Those carcasses that are not sent to the showground will be paid for by the abattoir on a deadweight basis. Presentation of the Trophies will take place at the Lamb Carcass Section at the show at 2.30pm on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> June 2018, and will be followed by a public auction of the carcasses.
