Another very pleasing entry saw another good trade but with more restrictions on eating on the beef trade is slipping and this saw a slight easing on the stores. As last week fewer stronger cattle on offer with shorter-term steers £1030 -£1060 (185 – 195p/kg) topping at £1088 (197p/kg) for Charolais steers from Mrs H Whitcombe, Minety. The stronger medium-term steers were a similar trade to last week trading between £930 - £1000 (180 - 190p/kg) with the general medium-term steers lacking the quality of previous weeks between £770 - £850 (170 – 180p/kg).

The stronger framed Friesian steers topped at £785 (145p/kg) from M/s J D Wright & Son, Baydon with medium sorts £600 - £700 (130 - 140p/kg).

A few stronger short-term heifers traded between £930 - £980 (180 - 190p/kg) topping at £990 (180p/kg) for a Charolais from M/s C Poultney & Sons, Dursley. The stronger farming heifers traded between £840 - £920 (170 -185p/kg) with the medium-term & younger heifers trading between £750 - £850 (175 - 190 p/kg).

A better show of younger stores & weaned calves met a good solid trade with a run of organic Herefords (9 – 12mnths) to £625 (186p/kg) & £612 (188p/kg) for the steers & £638 (170p/kg) & £605 (186p/kg) for the heifers from M/sTurnstone Farming, Stow on the Wold. British Blue steers (9 – 11mnths) sold to £640 (185p/kg) from Mrs C Tyler, Milton Hill. A run of South Devon & Limousin steers (5 – 8mnths) sold to £775 (201p/kg), £718 (188p/kg) & £600 (222p/kg) from Mr T Bellamy, Bisley. Aberdeen Angus steers (9 – 11mnths) sold to £888 (211p/kg) from M/s D & J Gilder, Winchcombe.
