## 54 REARING CALVES

10.30 am - Auctioneers: Jon Pullin  
Bulls £505, Heifers £322

What a difference in one week today's trade pounds dearer. Quality generally better and just a couple of fresh keen faces making prices sharper. Richard Andrews sent a tremendous Friesian to make £310 whilst EJ Pike & Son sold a good Friesian at £150 avg £62. Native trade and quality better. Aberdeen Angus bulls to £320 for JD Wright & Son, Hereford to £350 for Alf Jones and £322 for AR & M Highman & Sons, mediums of these breeds much firmer. Continental trade for the best firmer again with a large British Blue (3 weeks) from JR & SE Cook making £505, £422 for Cimarron Partnership, 11 Blues avg £333, Simmental bulls sold to £395 and £392 for RJ & TJ Andrews and Limousin's from RW Bevin & Son sold well to £250.

Heifers also dearer with a superb British Blue from L Lewis at £322 other good British Blues at £238 for the Cimarron Partnership. Medium Native calves dearer Angus and Hereford in the £170 - £180 bracket, more could have been sold to advantage today.

## 360 STORE CATTLE

Avg: Steers £772 (168p/kg), Heifers £610 (145p/kg)

A larger entry met a much sharper trade but the entry was of better quality than the previous week with some good runs of stronger, farming cattle.

The stronger farming short term steers met a good solid, dearer trade and up probably £30 - £50 on last week between £1040 - £1080 ((170 - 190p/kg) topping at £1125 (177p/kg), £1082 (181p/kg) & 1070 (175p/kg) for Limousin steers from M/s B, C & N Ford, Driffield. The better bred younger & stronger farming steers were again a good solid trade trading between £900 - £100 (170 - 190p/kg) topping at £1042 (193p/kg) for Charolais steers from Mr A B Gallop, Oxlynych. The younger sorts were between £770 - £870 (175 - 200p/kg). The second & third quality sorts were in shorter supply and also a sharper trade.

The native breeds saw the stronger sorts topping at £1085 (166p/kg) for a Hereford from M/s B, C & N Ford, Driffield. The farming sorts were £780 - £930 (168 - 178p/kg).

The Friesian steers were in short supply with the stronger sorts topping at £850 (134p/kg) from M/s E Burson & Son, Grove. The medium sorts were £515 - £600 (114 - 130p/kg) generally.

The heifers were in short supply but also a firmer trade with the few stronger near meat sorts trading between £920 - £965 (155 - 170p/kg) topping at £995 (182p/kg) for a British Blue from Mr D K Broadstock, Brimpsfield. The stronger farming heifers were generally £800 - £900 (155 - 170p/kg). The medium types £650 - £750 (150 - 165p/kg) & lesser sorts £500 - £600 (120 - 140p/kg).

A few good weaned calves saw Simmental steers (6 - 7mths) to £665 (187p/kg), & 588 (196p/kg) & Limousin steers (5 - 7mths) to £608 (209p/kg) & £525 (250p/kg) from M/s T R Limbrick & Son, Sherborne. Hereford steers (4 - 6mths) to £560 (238p/kg) & £545 (201p/kg) from M/s Sandfields Farm, North Nibley with their heifers to £440 (183p/kg) & £422 (162p/kg).

A very pleasing entry with the only market in the area with increased numbers this week with many centres struggling for lambs. Trade was very similar and seems to be stuck around the same figures fluctuating a £1 or £2 either way and generally very lacklustre.

The few better bred meat lambs were 174 – 178p/kg topping at 180p/kg £66.50 for 37kg from Mr C Benson. The general, good meat lambs traded between 168 – 174p/kg with looser coated sorts were 162 – 165p/kg. The few heavier lambs sold mostly between £78 - £80 topping at £82 for 52½kg from Mr R Foote.

**573 STORE LAMBS:** Another very pleasing entry saw a good trade throughout considering the fat prices. The stronger framed sorts in short supply mostly between £60 - £65. Medium farming lambs were £53 - £58 & smaller long term lambs £50 - £55. The very small & backward lambs again seemed well sold between £25 - £45.

**236 BREEDING EWES:** Not much to write home about quality wise with most of the older ewes around cull value. A smart Suffolk theaves sold to £90 from M/s C Fleming. Young Continental ewes to £86 from Mr J Theyer. A dispersal of Texel x ewes (flock ages) from the late Mr A Goscombe sold between £65 - £73.

**46 BREEDING RAMS:** Similar to the ewes with the end of run rams meeting little interest as many now have their rams. The few smart sorts saw Texel Shearlings to £300 & £280 from M/s D & R Williams & Son. Most stronger rams £100 - £150.

A larger entry and as the lamb trade not real bite to it. The entry saw very few good ewes on offer with the stronger Continental & Suffolk between £70 - £74. Mules £52 - £58. The half meat sorts were £55 - £62. The medium half meat ewes were £45 - £55 & smaller sorts £35 - £45. Leaner grazing types were a fair trade with 4 farmer buyers looking for grazing ewes between £30 - £45. Cull rams to £80.

A nice entry of beef cattle but no real quality. The few better sorts saw Limousin heifers to 190p/kg from Mr R Deeley. Most cattle on offer were to lean and were 150 – 165p/kg.

A bit of resistance nationally on the cow trade but still a good trade today. No top cows on offer with the few better beef cows were 130 – 135p/kg topping at 138p/kg for a British Blue from Mr D Barton. The medium cows 105 – 112p/kg with plainer sorts 67 – 80p/kg.
