A strong trade for the quality on offer. Simmental bulls topped at £405 & a British Blue to £370 from Mr J Puddephatt with others £222 & £200 from M/s M & S Ledbury.

Native bull calves traded between £120 - £165 topping at £200 for a Hereford from M/s R Ponting & Son.

British Blue heifers traded between £125 - £150 topping at £185 from Mr J Puddephatt, Simmental heifers £175 & £150 from M/s R Ponting & Son. Aberdeen Angus heifers topped at £150 from M/s Holmleigh Dairy. A run of weaned calves met a good trade with Aberdeen Angus bulls to £390 & £370 and heifers £290 & £260.

Pedigree Saler cows & their Charolais heifer calves sold to £970 & £900 from M/s Millard Bros, Coopers Hill with their pedigree incalf Saler cows (Approx. 5mths) to £745 & £650. Grazing cows to £740 (119p/kg) from Mrs H Hardwick, Coppers Hill. A run of feeding bulls saw Hereford's to £778 & Friesian's to £715 from M/s M & H Windell, Luckington. Aberdeen Angus bulls to £1015 from M/s Crappers & Sons, Wootton Bassett.

Another pleasing entry saw a slight easing of the trade but still remarkably good but aided by generally a lesser quality entry with quite a few cattle showing the weather already.

The stronger shorter-term steers continue at a very good traded between £1160 - £1200 (185 - 195p/kg) topping at £1288 (196p/kg) for Aberdeen Angus steers from M/s R Pert & Sons, East Challow. Not many stronger medium-term steers on offer today trading between £985 - £1052 (180 - 190p/kg). The general medium-term steers saw the edge just off the trade between £760 - £900 (175 - 185p/kg).

A few stronger short-term heifers traded over £1000 (170 - 180p/kg) topping at £1072 (160p/kg) for a Simmental from Mr L McLoughlin, Nailsworth. The stronger farming heifers traded between £880 - £990 (170 - 185p/kg). The medium-term & younger heifers trading between £750 - £850 (175 - 190p/kg).

A few younger stores & weaned calves sold well with organic Hereford steers (10 - 12mths) to £732 (185p/kg) & £730 (190p/kg) from M/s Turnstone Farming, Stow on the Wold with their heifers to £598 (170p/kg) & £582 (166p/kg). Aberdeen Angus bulls (4 - 6mths) sold to £522 (189p/kg) & £475 (202p/kg) from M/s R & F Brice & Son, Brinkworth.

Hereford Heifers (6mths) sold to £680 (206p/kg) from M/s Harrow Farms, Elmstone Hardwicke. British Blue steers (9 - 10mths) sold to £822 (184p/kg) from Mr P Baker, Leigh.

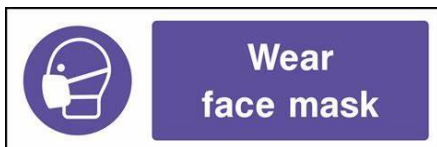
Please note: Licenses are issued on a first come first served basis & may take up to 5 working days to process.

As such, short notice requests may not be issued in time. Cattle can enter an Orange market if they have tested negative within 90 days of a new or repeat herd test, even if reactors are found (reactors must be removed from the holding prior to applying for a licence).

Cattle are **NO LONGER ALLOWED** to return home.

The only onward movement allowed will be to an Approved Finishing Unit (AFU) or an abattoir.

GOVERNMENT HAS CONFIRMED THAT FACE COVERINGS MUST BE WORN BY ALL CUSTOMERS AND OTHER VISITORS ATTENDING ENGLISH INDOOR LIVESTOCK MARKETS.

Another decent entry that has seen another lift in the trade and one of the dearest of the week and today we were again some 8 – 10p/kg dearer than most other Thursday centres.

The few pens of best, tight coated lambs traded between 230 – 240p/kg topping at 247p/kg £95 for 38½kg from Mr M Hobbs. All the good meat, general handyweight sorts were 215 – 222p/kg with a few leaner & lesser lambs 200 – 210p/kg.

Medium weight lambs (43 – 46kg) traded between £95 – £100 topping at £105 for 43½kg (241p/kg) from C Spence. The heavier lambs (47 – 50kg) traded between £105 – £108 topping at £110 twice for 50kg & 52kg from Mr W Harbinson & Mrs H Whitcombe respectively.
