Heifer trade very strong but more quality on offer. £375 for British Blue from JR & SE Cook, £310 for GJ & FL Robertson. Charolais £292 and £288 for DJ Spratt, Simmental to £280 for E J Pike & Son. A few weaned Friesians looked fair value £165 - £200.

A short entry sold to a very good trade on all forward and more needed to meet demand.

The stronger farming steers traded between £950 - £1100 (170 - 175p/kg) topping at £1185 (182p/kg) for Limousin steer from Mr E Gash, Leigh. The general well grown farming steers traded between £880 - £1000 (175 - 185p/kg) & the younger sorts £800 - £850 (190 - 200p/kg).

The Friesian steers saw a top of £780 (163p/kg) from M/s S Poultney & Son, Frocester with younger sorts £500 - £550 (130 - 140p/kg).

The stronger farming heifers traded between £900 - £970 (170 - 180p/kg) topping at £988 (178p/kg) for Limousin's again from Mr E Gash, Leigh. Limousin's from M/s G Maidment & Son, Cleverton sold to £972 (170p/kg). The general farming types seemed well sold between £700 - £800 (165 - 180p/kg).

The younger stores & weaned calves were exceptionally dear with Simmental steers (7mths) to £870 (245p/kg), £820 (244p/kg) & £800 (262p/kg) from M/s W Lane & Partners, Denchworth with their heifers to £645 (201p/kg) & £630 (185p/kg). Simmental steers (8 - 10mths) from Mr M Langsbury, Andoversford sold to £870 (204p/kg). A run calves from M/s A & M Highman & Sons, Corston saw Hereford steers (5 - 10mths) to £610 (234p/kg) & £580 (331p/kg) with their Friesian steers to £465 (209p/kg).

Actually a better trade than the averages state due to the quality of the entry. Very few good meat, shaped lambs on offer with these trading between 174 – 180p/kg topping at 200p/kg £90 for 45kg from M/s D T & R Williams & Son. The general commercial lambs were 168 – 172p/kg with the looser coated & lesser breeds 160 – 165p/kg generally. The heavier sorts were generally £77 – £80.

Again the average doesn't tell the tale with a lot of very small or lean ewes on offer. Trade was a shade firmer throughout with the few stronger Suffolk & Continental ewes traded between £70 – £80 with Mules to £58 – £65. The half meat & smaller meat ewes traded between £60 – £65 with the leaner grazing ewes were between £43 – £54. The small ewes were a good trade between £18 – £30. Rams sold to £87.

70 CATTLE

Steers 184p/kg, Heifers 178p/kg, Cows 110p/kg

A very pleasing entry of beef cattle met a good trade throughout with trade up some 10p/kg on most of the other local centres. The better sorts traded over 200p/kg topping at 210p/kg for a 560kg Bazadaise steer from M/s P & T Akers. The general good meat sorts were 180 – 195p/kg with the leaner or lesser shaped sorts 160 – 170p/kg generally.

30 cows on offer sold to a good trade despite reports of shorter allocations at most abattoirs. The better meat beef cows traded between 135 – 150p/kg topping at 164p/kg for a 630kg Limousin from M/s E Pearce & Son. The medium beef cows were 120 – 128p/kg with leaner or over fat types 88 – 100p/kg.

The dairy cows saw the better meat to 120p/kg from M/s U Godsell & Sons with the leaner types 80 – 90p/kg & plain cows 60 – 78p/kg.

SALE REPORT – 18TH NOVEMBER

Voyce Pullin received instructions to conduct a Genuine Dispersal Sale of Tractors and Machinery from a 300 acres arable and Livestock unit forming part of the Badminton Estate on behalf of the late John Knight.

Auctioneers, Richard Barrow and Jon Pullin were only slowed up by the queue of buyers trying to reach the next item, such was the turnout on a muddy and wet Saturday, 18th November 2017.

The kit although well worked had been well maintained on farm. Two vehicles had stood untouched in an open fronted shed for almost 20 years; first to sell was the International 674 (1976) non-running but helped by being one owner, she sold above expectations to secure £2,200. The other occupier of the shed was a pristine Series 3 Landrover (1983) sold last of the day with a genuine 16,000 miles, running but not moving. The hammer fell at £4,200 and seemed a good investment not knowing what extra work may be hiding probably put one or two off, still a decent price.

The front running tractors saw the 2007 MF 6465 Dyna6 with new fronts but needing new rears reach a good £22,500 whilst the 20 year old MF6170 Dynashift made £7,200 which was okay for condition. The farms Caterpillar TH336 although on a 12 plate was a 2010 build and made £16,100 or just over £18,000 with its basic attachments. The kit also made fair money; a Lemken Europal 6 5+1 Plough made £3,450 whilst a tidy Simba 6m Versatilth made a solid £2,280, a Maschio DM300 made £2,250 whilst the Marston Trailers of 2003 and 1994, always good sellers sold well at £3,700 and £3,000.

Out of season kit can be difficult but not here, an aged Opico Quiet 595 Gas Drier, always kept outside made £3,000 whilst the NH Combine TX62 with a 20' Header fought hard to achieve a good £15,000. We are grateful to Steve Bush for allowing the use of his yard for car parking.
