



# CIRENCESTER LIVESTOCK MARKET REPORT

**MONDAY 23<sup>RD</sup> AUGUST 2021**

## 113 TB RESTRICTED STORE CATTLE

2.00 pm – Auctioneer: Chris Voyce

Avg: Steers £902 (202p/kg), Heifers £703 (189p/kg)

A reasonable entry met another very good trade with the stronger short term farming steers trading well between £1280 - £1360 (190 – 210p/kg) topping at £1458 (195p/kg) & £1408 (217p/kg) for Simmental & Aberdeen Angus steers respectively from M/s H E Farnsworth & Son, Chedworth Laines.

The stronger medium term farming steers traded between £1050 - £1200 (210 – 225p/kg) topping at £1280 (208p/kg) for British Blue's from Mr R B Gallop, Wotton under Edge. The younger medium-term steers were £880 - £1000 (210 – 225p/kg) topping at £1120 (229p/kg) for Aberdeen Angus steers from Mr P Dangerfield, Stroud.

Only a few heifers forward topped at £1290 (191p/kg) for a Simmental from M/s H E Farnsworth & Son, Chedworth Laines. The medium-term heifers were £845 - £980 (190 – 205p/kg).

A handful of weaned calves (3 – 4mths) saw British Blue steers to £300 & heifers to £285.

Avg: Steers £1169 (216p/kg), Heifers £962 (210p/kg)

A decent entry and a look at the averages tells you the quality of the entry with some grand stronger cattle forward but another exceptional trade to match.

The stronger short-term steers continue at extremely high levels with a run of 41 steers from Mr T Harding, Kington dominating the leading prices trading between £1350 - £1530 (210 – 235p/kg) topping at £1600 (224p/kg) for a Charolais.

The stronger medium-term steers were also a remarkable trade between £1100 - £1200 (210 – 230p/kg). The general medium-term steers were £1050 – 1100 (205 – 215p/kg). The younger steers again seemed very well sold between £900 - £1000 (230 – 240p/kg) topping at £1142 (224p/kg) for Aberdeen Angus steers (16mths) from Mr C Goodman, Braydon. South Devon steers (15 – 16mths) sold to £1095 (226p/kg) from Mr T Bellamy, Bisley & a run of Limousin steers (12 – 14mths) sold to £1045 (243p/kg) & £955 (242p/kg) from M/s D & A Dando, Old Sodbury.

Only a few Friesian steers saw British Friesian's to £952 (203p/kg) from Mr R Gawthrop, Little Somerford.

A decent show of short term or stronger medium-term heifers saw British Blue's to £1240 (184p/kg) from Mrs G Greenaway, Cirencester. Aberdeen Angus sold to £1180 (193p/kg) & £1100 (191p/kg) from M/s C & C Bosley, East Challow. The medium-term sorts were around the £1000 (205 – 225p/kg) with the younger heifers looking well sold with between £880 - £1000 (220 – 240p/kg) topping at £1055 (240p/kg) & £1040 (236p/kg) for Limousin's (12 – 16mths) from M/s D & A Dando, Old Sodbury.

Another similar entry has seen the trade ease as the week as progressed but today saw a decent trade and ahead of most other Thursday centres. A mixed entry saw some good lambs forward but also a fair percentage of lesser breeds. The best meat tight coated lambs traded between 245 – 250p/kg topping at 253p/kg £110 for 43½kg from M/s D T & R M Williams & Son. The general lambs traded between 235 – 245p/kg. The medium weight lambs (45 – 48kg) traded between £115 - £123 and the heavier sorts topped at £130 for 49kg again from M/s D T & R M Williams & Son.

The leaner grazing & plain ewes traded generally £80 - £90 and the plain & very plain ewes & lesser breeds £65 - £75. Rams sold to £146.

## SUCCESSION PLANNING

Succession planning can be one of the hardest discussions to have within a family, however can be one of the most important in order to make sure that the legacy of the farm and business can continue successfully into the future, along with the wishes of the deceased being met when they are sadly no longer around. Unfortunately, we are seeing time and time again that these plans are not being put in place, consequently having massive effects on finances, mentality and relationships.

**What problems can be caused without a sufficient plan being in place?**

Family disputes, Unwanted persons claiming part or whole of the estate, Large inheritance tax bill, Not fulfilling tax reliefs available, Large capital gains tax bill, Land registry problems, Tenancy problems, Selling of whole or part of the holding, Splitting of the holding or farming business, Grant funding problems

**The main areas to consider when thinking about putting together a succession plan:**

How and who owns the assets? Is the title(s) for property registered with the land registry?, Who occupies the land and buildings and on what basis/tenancy type?, What are the short-, medium- and long-term objectives of the farming business?, What role does each family member play now and likely to play in the future of the business?, What developments, skills or experience do the younger generation need to acquire?, Who will inherit/be transferred, what asset in the short, medium and long term?, What provisions will be made for those members not involved in the business?, What income does each party receive and require from the family business? Where will each member of the family live, now and in the future? Is there documentation in place for each party on their death? What happens if the people die in a different order to what was expected?

Succession planning takes time and is a personal process, with each plan having to be tailored to the parties and the farming business. Along with this, tax and law are very complicated matters and need to be approached in the correct manner. Therefore, investing time today and keeping a plan updated can far outweigh the unforeseen problems and larger costs in the future.
