Avg: Steers £981 (182p/kg), Heifers £878 (176p/kg)

A short entry of mostly medium-term native breeds sold to a very pleasing trade. The few stronger sorts topped at £1265 (181p/kg) for a Hereford steers from Mrs G Greenaway, Cirencester & £1122 (184p/kg) from M/s A Hook & Sons, Tortworth. Most traded between £975 - £1020 (180 - 195p/kg). The heifers topped at £1048 (175p/kg) & £942 (174p/kg) for Hereford's again from M/s A Hook & Sons. British Blues sold to £985 (175p/kg) from Mr B Hillier, Minety. The younger heifers all being native sorts traded well between £800 - £900 (175 - 180p/kg).

Cattle can enter an Orange market if they have tested negative within 90 days of a new or repeat herd test, even if reactors are found (reactors must be removed from the holding prior to applying for a licence).

Cattle are **NO LONGER ALLOWED** to return home.

The only onward movement allowed will be to an Approved Finishing Unit (AFU) or an abattoir.

Avg: Steers £887 (194p/kg), Heifers £839 (187p/kg)

A very pleasing entry for the time of year with the cattle seeming to be coming earlier due to the very good trade. Trade in many centres has eased over the last week but it was not noticeable today with another terrific trade. This was helped by an extremely good show of cattle but trade certainly no less.

The stronger shorter-term steers continue at a very good traded between £1230 - £1300 (190 - 200p/kg) topping at £1380 (206p/kg), £1325 (208p/kg) & £1268 (202p/kg) for Limousin steers from Mr D Hazell, Malmesbury & £1300 (180p/kg) from Mr G Morse, Whitminster. The medium-term steers were again very well sold with the stronger sorts £1030 - £1150 (190 - 210p/kg). The general medium-term steers again seemed the dearest of the day between £900 - £1050 (195 - 210p/kg).

A few very good, stronger short-term heifers traded over £1150 (190 - 200p/kg) topping at £1295 (196p/kg), £1240 (190p/kg) & £1165 (186p/kg) for British Blue's from Mr Anton Smith, Badminton & £1198 (190p/kg) & £1170 (205p/kg) for Limousin's from Mr D Hazell, Malmesbury.

The stronger farming heifers traded between £900 - £1050 (185 - 205p/kg). The medium-term & younger heifers were well sold trading between £750 - £850 (185 - 200p/kg).

A few younger stores & weaned calves sold well with Hereford steers (11 - 12mths) to £705 (170p/kg) from Mr R Davies, Birdlip. British Blue steers (10 - 11mths) to £635 (190p/kg) from Mrs C Tyler, Milton Hill & Simmental steers (7 - 11mths) to £605 (190p/kg) from M/s T Clark & Son, Crudwell.

A decent entry that has seen a lift in the trade from the early part of the week with abattoirs dropping the deadweight price then been forced out to buy numbers as entries have gone short nationally.

A trade never seen in late August with the best, tight coated lambs traded between 228 - 232p/kg topping at 234p/kg £90 for 38½kg from Mr N Ponting. The good meat better general handyweight sorts were 208 - 218p/kg with a few leaner & lesser lambs 202 - 206p/kg.

Medium weight lambs (44 - 46kg) saw the better sorts trading between £94 - £100 & the general sorts £90 - £93. The heavier lambs (47 - 50kg) traded between £98 - £100 topping at £110 (220p/kg) for 50kg from Mr J Voyce.

Texel x sold to £99 & £90 from Rudgeway Farms & £97 & £95 from M/s RJ & B Kimber. Medium Suffolk ewe lambs traded well between £80 - £85 and seemed well sold. The Store lambs saw all the stronger near meat sorts going to the abattoir between £78 - £90.
