Avg: Steers £882 (167p/kg), Heifers £858 (163p/kg)

A short entry of mostly stronger feeding cattle with the trade extremely good on all forward. The stronger better farming cattle were a remarkably good trade and as dear if not dearer than unrestricted trading between £1050 - £1100 topping at £1172 (165p/kg) for a Hereford steer from Mr E Evans, Haresfield. A grand run of Saler x cattle from Mr M Green, Shellingford saw steers to £1155 (165p/kg), £1120 (175p/kg) & £1102 (181p/kg) with the heifers £932 (186p/kg) & £ 915 (178p/kg). The farming steers were a fair trade with the stronger sorts £800 - £900 (170 - 185p/kg) & heifers £700 - £800 (150 - 160p/kg). A handful of cows were a strong trade with Friesian's to £840 (105p/kg) & £790 (107p/kg) from M/s J Simpkins & Partners, Easton Grey.

A useful crowd were in attendance when Alf & Jackie Jones dispersed their non-recorded herd of Friesians at Cirencester Market.

The cows were sold in their working clothes in an all year round calving pattern being a useful bunch of cows not pushed hard and that would surely go onto milk well in their new homes. Top call of £900 came for Lot 21, a December calved cow giving 32 kg, Lot 3 reached £850 a Cancourt bred Cow dry and due her second in April. The Brown Swiss Cancourt bred Cow of Kelp breeding sold dry and due April to Jo-Dee Nemo Richard ET and made £820.

Averages - 37 cows and 2 bulling heifers £570.

A very pleasing entry met a better than expected trade considering the uncertainty of the beef price. Trade was very similar to last week with all sorts on offer & all well sold.

The good shaped strong Continental farming steers traded between £1080 - £1120 (190 - 200p/kg) topping at £1122 (200p/kg) & £1102 (196p/kg) for Limousin's from M/s A & J Morland, Shirley. The general stronger farming steers were £980 - £1050 (175 - 190p/kg). The younger farming sorts were generally £850 - £920 (185 - 200p/kg).

The native breeds saw the stronger sorts £1000 - £1080 (175 - 185p/kg) topping at £1100 (174p/kg) for an Aberdeen Angus from M/s A Webb & Son, Cleverton. The general farming steers were £850 - £900 (170 - 180p/kg).

A good trade on the few Friesian steers with the stronger sort's over £850 (140 - 145p/kg) topping at £922 (139p/kg) from M/s A Webb & Son, Cleverton. The medium types were well sold between £570 - £650 (135 - 150p/kg).

The few stronger farming heifers were £900 - £1000 (175 - 180p/kg) topping at £1098 (186p/kg) for a Limousin from Mr T Greves, Leafield. The general stronger sorts were dearer between £800 - £900 (165 - 180p/kg) & the younger sorts £680 - £750 (160 - 170p/kg). The native breeds were no dearer topping at £905 (150p/kg) for an Aberdeen Angus from M/s R Simpkins & Partners, Luckington.

Very few weaned calves today with Simmental steers (5mths) to £535 (187p/kg) from Mr J Millard, Grittenham & British Blue steers (12mths) to £745 (204p/kg) & £ 695 (201p/kg) from Mrs C Tyler, Milton Hill.

Bulls £350, Heifers £220

A good trade for the calves forward today with the best sorts as always shining through and making the most but looking best value.

The few Friesians on offer averaged £60. Native calves very short in supply and generally only medium quality. Aberdeen Angus bulls to £130 and a 1st quality Hereford at £245 for MT & I Scott. He also supplied Bazadaise bulls to £300 and £350 with a very nice beef bred Blonde form CJE Warr & Sons at £350, Simmentals to £298 and £320 from John Millard. Quality Limousin's from RC Ponting & Son and £280 - £285.

Heifer trade more selective with the few first quality sorts over £200 to a top of £220 for RC Pointing's Limousin and £212 for J Millard's Simmental.

A run of weaned saw British Blue steers to £330 for AA Farthing and 3-4 month Aberdeen Angus from AC Daniel topping at £380. Weaned British Blue heifers from the Farthing family sold to £235 with Aberdeen Angus from the same home at £250.

A very good entry but the reality is "if it's what they want the trade is very good, if it's not then extremely difficult". The handyweight export hoggetts have taken a slight lift and traded between 195 - 210p/kg topping at 218p/kg £85 for 39kg from M/s C & T Shaw. The more looser coated & lesser breed handyweights seemed well sold between 188 - 195p/kg.

The medium weight 45 - 48kg hoggetts are the ones that have become extremely difficult for the home trade to cope with and trade generally between £76 - £80 topping at £84 for 45kg from Mrs V Knight. The meatier heavier hogs were a similar trade for the top end between £88 - £90 topping at £91 for 62kg from M/s D & R Williams & Son. The next grade down were harder work between £84 - £88.
