210 TB RESTRICTED STORE CATTLE

Avg: Steers £525 (131p/kg), Heifers £640 (151p/kg)

A reasonable entry but not of the best quality with a high percentage of smaller second & third quality sorts on offer.

The stronger farming cattle were a good, firm trade with steers £1035 - £1098 (165 - 180p/kg) topping at £1172 (186p/kg) for a Hereford steer from M/s D Rumming & Sons, Lydiard Tregoze. The heifers were £850 - £950 (160 - 175p/kg) topping at £1000 (189p/kg) for a Limousin from the same home.

The younger steers saw the better sorts a good trade between £800 - £950 (180 - 200p/kg) topping at £965 (189p/kg) for Limousin's from M/s J & C Elliott, Purton Stoke & Saler steers to £800 (170p/kg) & £680 (194p/kg) from M/s K & M Bennett, Cromhall. Aberdeen Angus steers sold to £880 (210p/kg) from M/s R & S Bennett, Tockenham & £965 (180p/kg) from M/s M & S Dyer, Hambrook. The better bred younger heifers were £600 - £700 (170 - 180p/kg).

The lesser shaped cattle or out of spec sorts are difficult to place except at lower figures generally between £250 - £350 (120 - 140p/kg) & the very poor sorts £150 - £250 (80 - 110p/kg).

A few cows saw Friesian's to £715 (100p/kg) from M/s Hartpury University with Hereford's to £950 (131p/kg) from Mrs D Smith & Sons & Aberdeen Angus to £880 (113p/kg) from M/s D Rumming & Sons.

Avg: Steers £716 (168p/kg), Heifers £592 (154p/kg)

A few less forward met a good, solid trade with the better cattle as dear as the last few weeks & the younger & second quality sorts dearer.

The stronger Continental farming short term steers met another good solid trade between £1000 - £1080 (160 - 170p/kg) topping at £1085 (160p/kg) for a Simmental from M/s F Powell & Sons, Avening. The native breeds saw the stronger sorts topping the day at £1105 (150p/kg) for an Aberdeen Angus steer from the same home.

The better bred younger & stronger farming steers were again a good solid trade trading between £850 - £1000 (160 - 190p/kg). The younger sorts were between £770 - £870 (175 - 200p/kg). The second & third quality sorts were a shade dearer again this week between £500 - £600 (130 - 150p/kg).

The Friesian steers remain in short supply with the stronger sorts topping at £798 (130p/kg) & £762 (133p/kg) from Mr B Snell, Bucklebury. The medium sorts were £500 - £575 (100 - 115p/kg) generally.

The heifers met a good trade with the few stronger near meat sorts trading between £900 - £1000 (150 - 165p/kg) topping at £1048 (166p/kg) for a British Blue from M/s J A Jones & Son, Cricklade. The stronger native heifers topped at £1000 (161p/kg) from M/s H Farnsworth & Son, Chedworth Laines. The stronger farming heifers were generally £800 - £900 (155 - 170p/kg). The medium types £650 - £750 (150 - 165p/kg) & lesser sorts £500 - £600 (120 - 140p/kg).

A few good weaned calves met a fair trade with Simmental steers (6 - 8mths) to £750 (220p/kg), £732 (228p/kg) & £ 685 (217p/kg) from M/s W Lane & Partners, Denchworth. British Blue steers (9 - 11mths) sold to £732 (190p/kg) & £ 730 (207p/kg) from Mr A Smith, Badminton with his British Blue heifers to £678 (180p/kg). Limousin heifers (7 - 8mths) sold to £600 (200p/kg) from M/s T Limbrick & Son, Sherborne. The lesser bred weaned calf were a very pleasing trade with steers £325 - £450 (150 - 170p/kg).

A difficult trade was experienced but as a number of people commented, there is nothing wrong with the trade, but a number of calves lacking quality. Many calves lacking that freshness and bloom and without that good start they are difficult to sell.

Best calves still a strong trade, JR & SE Cook sold British Blue bulls to £415 with Simmental from RJ & TJ Andrews to £340 and £300. Alf Jones sold good Hereford bulls to £270 but plenty of 3rd quality sorts difficult to place at £90 - £150.

Best British Blue heifers saw £310 for JR & SE Cook and a smart Simmental from RC Ponting & £200. 20 averaged £103.

3 month weaned Herefords reached £252 for Garsden Farm and a good Hereford heifer from H B Farms made £350.

The half meated sorts were £54 - £60. The medium half meated ewes were £48 - £55 & smaller sorts £35 - £45. Leaner grazing types were a fair trade between £30 - £45.

A pleasing entry in both sections. The beef cattle sold to a good firm trade with the better sorts over 190p/kg topping at 210p/kg for a 705kg Limousin heifer from Mr H J Noad. The general sorts were 170 - 180p/kg with a few leaner types 150 - 160p/kg.

A pleasing cow entry met a better than expected trade and ahead of most other local centres. The few better meat beef cows were 135 - 140p/kg topping at 150p/kg for a 615kg Bazadaise from M/s P & T Akers. The medium beef cows were 120 - 130p/kg with the leaner sorts 80 - 90p/kg. The dairy cows saw medium cows 85 - 105p/kg with leaner sorts 70 - 80p/kg & the few very plain cows were 60 - 70p/kg.
