



# CIRENCESTER LIVESTOCK MARKET REPORT

**TUESDAY 2<sup>ND</sup> OCTOBER 2018**

## 101 REARING CALVES

10.30 am - Auctioneers: Jon Pullin  
Bulls £400, Heifers £250

A generally firm trade throughout the day with the best calves a bit back on recent weeks.

No first quality dairy sorts on offer with a Dairy Shorthorn to £110 and a dozen Friesians to £60.

Continental bulls saw Simmental to £400 for B Gough & Sons and £390 for RJ & TJ Andrew, British Blues to £360 for L Lewis. A few medium Native calves traded to £200 generally.

Heifer calf trade was fairly solid, British Blue to £235 for JR & SE Cook, Simmental to £235 for B Gough. Angus heifers reached £250 for P Beard and a tidy run of Hereford heifers topped at £165 for Parkmill Farms Ltd.

A run of weaned calves saw British Blue steers (4-5 mnths) to £450 and £468 from TT & H Barber and Hereford to £370 for M/s H & P Saunders. Aberdeen Angus from the same home made £355. British Blue heifers made £345 Hereford and Simmental heifers to £270 and £288 for M/s H & P Saunders.

## 274 STORE CATTLE

11.00 am - Auctioneers: Jon Pullin & Chris Voyce  
Avg: Steers £707 (161p/kg), Heifers £623 (148p/kg)

A few more numbers coming forward but an entry of cattle showing signs of the weather and one of the poorest shows we have had in a long while. Same story the stronger and better bred cattle a good trade but the second & third quality sorts extremely difficult to sell.

Only a few cattle which have a hard food which paid dividends with Aberdeen Angus steers to £1175 (165p/kg) & £1092 (168p/kg) for Aberdeen Angus steers from M/s R Pert & Sons, East Challow. Limousin steers sold to £1075 (188p/kg) & £995 (197p/kg) from M/s A & V Albutt & Sons, Winchcombe.

The better bred stronger farming steers were again a good solid trade trading between £900 - £980 (170 - 190p/kg) topping at £1015 (173p/kg) & £925 (177p/kg) for Hereford steers from M/s G Gardner & Son, St Catherine's. The younger sorts were between £800 - £900 (170 - 190p/kg). The second & third quality sorts have become extremely difficult to place except at low money mostly £500 - £600 (140 - 155p/kg).

The Friesian steers are generally a hard to place with one pen of better British Friesian steers to £700 (135p/kg) from M/s S Poultney & Son, Frocester. Most medium & smaller sorts £300 - £400 (75 - 100p/kg).

Same story with the heifers with the few stronger sorts topping at £955 (187p/kg) for Limousin's from M/s A & V Albutt & Sons, Winchcombe. The stronger farming heifers were generally £760 - £850 (155 - 170p/kg) & the medium types £600 - £700 (150 - 160p/kg) & lesser sorts £450 - £550 (110 - 130p/kg).

A few decent weaned calves saw Aberdeen Angus steers (7 - 8mnths) to £600 from M/s Logan & Son, Brinkworth, (7 - 9mnths) to £805 (196p/kg) from Mr L Irvine, Norton & (10mnths) to £820 (207p/kg) from M/s D & J Gilder, Winchcombe.

Shorter entries everywhere this week has increased demand as the week has progressed resulting in a much firmer trade today. A more mixed show of lambs saw better bred lambs 175 – 180p/kg topped at 186p/kg £64 for 34½kg from Mr R Jackson. The general, good meat lambs traded between 170 – 175p/kg with looser coated sorts were 166 – 170p/kg. The few heavier lambs sold mostly between £78 - £80.

**553 STORE LAMBS:** Another decent entry saw the stronger framed sorts in short supply mostly between £63 - £67. Mediums farming lambs were £55 - £58 & smaller long term lambs £45 - £50. The very small & backward lambs seemed extremely well sold between £24 - £30.

**279 THEAVES & BREEDING EWES:** Not too much quality on offer. Continental ewes (Flock ages) sold to £110 from Ms J Faulkner. Suffolk theaves £80 - £90, Continental's £80 - £87. Older ewes or lesser bred theaves were approx. £10 - £20 above cull value.

**58 BREEDING RAMS:** The few better rams sold well topping at £440 for a Suffolk Shearling from M/s D & R Williams & Son. The best of the rest were £280 - £350 with the nest £160 - £200. Older rams or lesser sorts were cull value or above.

Trade continues at the same levels but today had a bit of bite in places but again a large percentage of very poor or very small ewes No real top ewes on offer with the stronger Continental & Suffolk topping at £80 with the half meated sorts £63 - £72. The medium half meated ewes were £45 - £55 & smaller sorts £35 - £45. Leaner grazing types were £30 - £40 with only the very small or very plain £15 - £20 generally.

### 39 BEEF CATTLE & BARREN COWS

Steers 186p/kg, Heifers 173p/kg, Cows 118p/kg

A better entry in both sections with few smart beef cattle on offer topping at 208p/kg for a Bazadaise steer & 205p/kg for a heifer both from M/s P & T Akers. The general run of cattle were 187 – 195p/kg with rest 174 – 180p/kg.

The cow trade reportedly less in many centres but another flying trade at Cirencester. The few better beef cows 135 – 140p/kg topping at 157p/kg from M/s D Smith & Sons. The meat dairy bred sorts 120 – 130p/kg topping at 139p/kg for a Swedish Red from M/s E & M Price. Medium cows 105 – 112p/kg with plainer sorts 72 – 88p/kg.

### BCMS UPDATE

When you apply for a passport, you should receive it within 14 days. If you don't, the passport will be treated as lost and you should contact BCMS.

If BCMS have issued the passport and you haven't received it, they will carry out checks and may send you a replacement free of charge if you have informed them within 6 weeks.

From 1 October 2018, if you do not inform BCMS within 6 weeks of the date the passport was produced, you will have to pay a fee of £20 per animal when you apply for the replacement passport. You should also tell BCMS if you've sent in a passport for any reason and you've not received it back within 14 days.
