



CIRENCESTER LIVESTOCK MARKET REPORT

TUESDAY 7TH SEPTEMBER 2021

40 REARING & WEANED CALVES

10.30 am – Auctioneer: Richard Barrow

Rearing Bulls to £495, Avg £138, Heifers to £200, Avg £108

A decent entry met a very strong trade with only a few best quality calves on offer and those did not disappoint. Top of the day was £495 for a British Blue bull calf from M/s C & E Best. £465 for a Simmental bull from M/s B Gough & Sons. A run of young Hereford calves trading well between £100 - £160 topping at £188 from Applevale Ltd. Best Aberdeen Angus heifers selling to £200 again from M/s C & E Best & Simmental's to £200 from M/s B Gough & Sons. A run of Hereford heifers generally £80 - £145 topping at £165 for stronger heifers from Applevale Ltd.

6 BEEF COWS

An Aberdeen Angus cow & her Hereford heifer calf sold to £1250 from Mr A Tuck, Tetbury. Hereford grazing cows sold to £1200 (148p/kg), £1170 (146p/kg) & £1075 (137p/kg) from Mr S Powell, Horton. A pedigree polled Simmental bull sold to £1460 from M/s H & A Whiting, Burghclere.

145 STORE CATTLE

Avg: Steers £1100 (218p/kg), Heifers £732 (205p/kg)

A similar entry saw a very strong trade with most cattle some £30 - £50 dearer. Not too much strength on offer with the few stronger short-term steers still a good trade topping at £1300 (186p/kg) & £1270 (199p/kg) for Simmental's from Mrs G Greenaway, Cirencester. The stronger medium-term steers were still a strong trade between £1100 - £1200 (210 - 230p/kg). The general medium-term steers were again an extremely strong trade between £1000 - £1100 (215 - 230p/kg). A run of organic cattle from M/s F C Turner & Son, Arlingham met a very good trade with British Blue steers to £1100 (242p/kg), Aberdeen Angus steers £1090 (232p/kg) & £1075 (244p/kg).

Again, not too much strength in the heifers with the stronger medium-term heifers being mostly native breeds trading between £900 - £980 (205 - 215p/kg) topping at £988 (217p/kg) for a Hereford x heifer from M/s J & E Goulding, Newent. The general medium-term & younger sorts were £800 - £880 (200 - 210p/kg).

A few weaned calves & young stores saw Hereford heifers (11mths) to £870 (191p/kg) from Mr D Rugman, Oldbury Naite & Aberdeen Angus heifers (11mths) to £645 (212p/kg) from M/s Manton Park Farms, Manton.

A much-reduced entry as the trade has eased all week but firmed slightly ahead of most Wednesday centres. We saw a very level trade with nearly all of our lambs trading between 220 – 230p/kg but many markets have seen a 2-tier trade with the meat selling but lean nearer 200p/kg and below.

The better meat, tighter coated lambs traded between 227 – 238p/kg topping at 250p/kg £80 for 32kg from C Payne. The general meat lambs traded between 220 – 226p/kg. The better medium weight lambs (44 - 48kg) traded between £105 - £108 with the heavier lambs £110 - £112 topping at £120 twice from M/s P & P Colson & Rough Grounds Farm Partnership.

The medium-term well-bred lambs looked well sold trading between £78 - £85. The long-term smaller sorts also looked well sold between £65 - £72 with the very small sorts £55 - £60.

A slightly shorter entry and nothing wrong with this trade. The very best Continental ewes were still a remarkably trade between £135 - £150 and Suffolk's £120 - £130. The general strong ewes were £115 - £120 with the half meat & meat medium Suffolk & Continental £105 - £115.

The strong meat Mules were around the £100 with stronger half meat sorts £88 - £95. The leaner grazing & plain ewes traded generally £78 - £88 and the plain & very plain ewes & lesser breeds £60 - £70. Rams sold to £100, Goats to £123.

108 PIGS

The better meat prime pigs were £80 - £100 topping at £115 from M/s W Tinney & Sons. The lesser sorts hard to place. Cull sows & boars remain difficult with sows to £50 & boars to £60. The store pigs remain a good trade generally on the better sorts topping at £70 with other £45 - £55.

The good beef cows were 158 – 162p/kg topping at 188p/kg £1415 for a Bazadaise again from M/s P & T Akers. Sussex bulls sold to £1457 (136p/kg) from M/s R & J Burr.

A decent entry of theaves saw probably a sharper trade than the first sale across the board. This sale the sheep looked in better condition and some good sheep forward.

The best Continental x Theaves saw Texel to £230, £228, £220 & £200 from M/s D T & R Williams & Son with all the stronger sort £180+. The rest were mostly smaller sorts trading between £160 - £170. Overall average £193.

The Suffolk x Mules saw the better-quality sorts trading between £168 - £178 topping at £188 & £180 from Mr N Ponting, Stanford in the Vale & £178 twice from Swangrove Farms, Badminton.

The medium's sorts seemed well sold between £163 - £170 and the smaller sorts generally £150 - £160 with the overage average £161.

The Mule section saw the best trade with the better sorts topping at £188 & £185 from Mr N Hughes, £185 from Mr A Jeffries, £180 & £175 from Mr N Ponting, Stanford in the Vale & £174 from R H Parry Partnership. The medium sorts were generally £160 - £170. Overall Average £171.
