A difficult trade on all but the best, weather really not helpful to calf rearing and those being sold just lacking in appearance, a few less buyers didn't assist the task.

That said the very best on a par to last time, British Blue Bulls to £410 for TT & H Barber, nothing else to compare. Good Hereford to £270 for A W Jones. Best British Blue heifers to £222 again for TT & H Barber, the better sorts on offer generally £170 - £180.

Steers Avg £726 (178p/kg), Heifers Avg £738 (165p/kg)

A reasonable entry as vendors get back into the swing of testing, etc saw a firm trade throughout.

Not much strength on offer with the stronger farming steers £950 - £1050 (175 - 190p/kg) topping at £1125 (165p/kg) for a Charolais steer from Mr J Hankins, Minchinhampton. The general farming steers were £770 - £880 (180 - 190p/kg) with the few lesser sorts £600 - £750 (155 - 165p/kg).

The heifers saw a top of £1092 (161p/kg) for strong Beef Shorthorn heifers from Mr R Bovill, Temple Guiting & Aberdeen Angus to £1042 (162p/kg) from Mr M Hankins, Nympsfield. The farming heifers traded between £750 - £820 (160 - 170p/kg).

A good trade on the weaned calves with Simmental steers (7 - 10mths) to £755 (235p/kg) & £750 (250p/kg) from M/s W Lane & Partners, Denchworth with their heifers to £645 (201p/kg) & £582 (219p/kg). Well grown Hereford steers (10mths) sold to £882 (181p/kg) from Mr M Inwood, Midgham.

January is always a difficult time to sell pigs and today's trade reflective of that in most areas, but the correct sized fat pigs sold reasonably with the bigger out of spec sorts looking very good value, but also more difficult to sell on again.

Cull Sow and Boar trade difficult with many smaller sows £50 and bigger sorts £70 - £100. A boar from Adrian Halle sold to £105 and a sow from R Sedgebeer to £92. Some very big fat boars were difficult to place but worked out at about 50p/kg £48 - £62. M/s Eadle sold correct sized fat at £78 and £79, others made £50 - £60 generally. Gloucester Old Spot breeding Gilts sold to £46 from Ray Hares and the smaller weaner pig trade had the most spark of the day. Saddlebacks from Gemma Potter sold well at £38 and £31 with stores from S Samuels to £26. A nice pen of White weaners from Abington & Witney College sold to £38 and a small pen of Pietrain x weaners from Mike Bennett made £41. Messrs Cullimore, Berkeley sold good coloured stores £32. An in pig Saddleback due February made £82.

A very mixed entry sold to a good trade and more could have been sold. Very few top quality cattle selling to a top of 212p/kg for a 605kg Blonde steer from M/s J & M Timbs. The commercial cattle seemed well sold trading between 170 - 175p/kg with the few overage & lesser sorts 155 - 170p/kg generally.

Another extremely dear cow trade and again well ahead of the other local centres. The beef cows saw the younger, meat sorts over 135p/kg topping at 165p/kg £1036 for a 630kg Aberdeen Angus from M/s F & L Parry. The medium beef cows again seemed extremely dear between 120 - 125p/kg with a few plainer sorts 80 - 90p/kg.

Please note: Licenses are issued on a first come first served basis & may take up to 5 working days to process. As such, short notice requests may not be issued in time. Cattle can enter an Orange market if they have tested negative within 90 days of a new or repeat herd test, even if reactors are found (reactors must be removed from the holding prior to applying for a licence).

Cattle are **NO LONGER ALLOWED** to return home. The only onward movement allowed will be to an Approved Finishing Unit (AFU) or an abattoir.
