41 REARING & WEANED CALVES

10.30 am – Auctioneer: Richard Barrow

Rearing Bulls to £325, Avg £160, Heifers to £280, Avg £171

A shorter entry of calves today saw the second quality calves soaring. Best bull calf topped at £325 for a Simmental bull from M/s R & T Andrews. Best native bulls selling well with Aberdeen Angus topping at £222 from M/s R Beard & Son with others £160 - £200. Hereford bulls traded between £120 - £200 topping at £212 from Mr A Jennings. British Blue bulls trading between £180 - £200 topping at £220 from M/s F E White & Sons.

A cracking shapely British Blue heifer reached £280 from Cimarron Partnership with others £180 - £200. Native heifers generally £90 - £140 topping at £170 from M/s R Beard & Son.

A Simmental cow 7 her Limousin heifer calf (5mths) sold to £1080 from Mr B Parry, Horsley with his Hereford cow & her Limousin steer calf (5mths) to £1020. In calf Aberdeen Angus heifers (PD+ 4 – 7mths) sold to £930.

279 STORE CATTLE

Avg: Steers £936 (214p/kg), Heifers £845 (193p/kg)

Another pleasing entry saw a sharper trade throughout with the farming cattle showing the biggest lift.

The stronger short-term steers were in short supply and another good trade but no dearer trading over £1300 to top at £1410 (202p/kg), £1362 (208p/kg) & £1355 (209p/kg) for Hereford steers from M/s T F Rymer & Son, Uley. The stronger medium-term steers were a very good, dearer trade between £1090 - £1200 (200 – 220p/kg) to top at £1365 (222p/kg) for a Simmental from Mr A Martin, Arlingham & Limousin's to £1340 (239p/kg) from M/s A & J Morland, Shirley.

The general medium-term steers were also a very strong, dearer trade between £950 - £1050 (210 – 230p/kg) with the younger steers £800 - £900 (210 – 230p/kg).

A good show of stronger short-term heifers met a very good trade with the best £1150+ to top at £1270 (223p/kg) for Limousin from M/s A & J Morland, Shirley. Charolais & Limousin heifers from A Brind farm Partnership, Lower Stanton St Quinton sold to £1160 (209p/kg) & £1155 (212p/kg).

The stronger medium-term heifers were £950 - £1080 (200 – 210p/kg) with the general medium-term & younger heifers a similar trade between £750 - £850 (175 – 190p/kg).

The weaned calves & young stores saw mixed quality on offer. The better sorts saw another good trade with Simmental steers (7 – 8mths) to £885 (253p/kg), £845 (249p/kg) & £800 (246p/kg) from M/s W Lane & Partners, Denchworth. Charolais steers (9mths) sold to £800 (225p/kg) from Mr C Ledgerwood, Weston with his heifers to £788 (188p/kg). British Blue steers (11 – 13mths) sold to £788 (232p/kg) from Mrs C Tyler, Milton Hill. A run of organic Aberdeen Angus heifers (13mths) from M/s Turnstone Farming, Stow on the Wold sold to £742 (177p/kg) & £700 (190p/kg). The lesser sorts were no dearer.

The trade took a major lift Friday through to Monday with abattoirs short on numbers and forced to buy. The trade has eased slightly from those dizzy heights but still remarkable good and some 67p/kg dearer than last year. The best meat handyweight lambs traded to a very strong trade between 285 – 290p/kg topping at 303p/kg £115 for 38kg from Mr C Payling. The general handyweight meat lambs traded between 265 – 275p/kg. The medium weight lambs (46 – 52kg) were also a very dear trade trading between £128 - £135 topping at £143 for 50½kg from Mr C Ashford. The heavier sorts were also a very good trade between £140 - £146 topping at £150 for 60kg from Mr A C Cook.

367 STORE LAMBS: A shorter entry saw another extremely dear trade with another lift in the finished trade boosting confidence and demand. Very little strength on offer with the few stronger, lean short-term lambs trading between £98 - £104. The medium-term well-bred lambs again looked extremely well sold trading between £85 - £95. The general medium-term lambs were £78 - £85 and the long-term smaller sorts also looked well sold between £72 - £80. The very small & backward sorts seem the dearest between £63 - £70.

CULL EWES TO £179

Another increased number forward following the continued strong trade at Cirencester. The ewe trade has also risen but again our trade was again well ahead of most other centres. The stronger Continental ewes traded between £125 - £135 topping at £179, Suffolk's £115 - £133. The half meat & meat medium Suffolk & Continental ewes looked a good trade between £95 - £115. The Mules have taken a lift with pen after pen of stronger sorts £108 - £115 topping at £120. The stronger half meat Mules £80 - £90. Leaner grazing & plain ewes traded generally £70 - £80. Meat small ewes £65 - £70 and the plain & very plain ewes & lesser breeds £35 - £50. Medium goats sold to £96. Strong rams were £130 - £140 with mediums £90 - £110.

The lesser pigs are difficult to get a bid for which also applies to the cull sows. The store pigs saw the better sorts £20 - £30 topping at £50. Again small & lesser sorts £2 - £15 and hard to place.

16 BARREN COWS & OVERAGE CATTLE: A similar entry saw another good trade for what was on offer. The better beef cows were 145 – 153p/kg topping at 170p/kg £1220 for a Limousin from M/s Home Farm Holdings. The medium beef cows were 115 – 125p/kg. Only plainer dairy cows on offer trading between 85 – 108p/kg.
